Hello Troop 66 Scouts, Scouters and Parents;

Meeting this week (Monday, January 23) is at the First Congregational Church (9th Ave. & Francis St) in Longmont.

THIS WEEK, we have another very exciting and packed meeting planned. Once again we are pleased to welcome some visitors to our troop who Arrow of Light Cub Scouts, and their parents, from Pack 673.

Once again, during the meeting we will break up into TWO teams for these Activity Stations: 1) First Aid/10 Essentials, and 2) Knots and Leatherwork. Each of these two stations will last 20 minutes and will include building a personal First Aid/Survival Kit for all Scouts (we have enough materials for Troop 66 Boy Scouts who haven't already made one and our visitors), and making a leather neckerchief slide (we have enough materials for Troop 66 Boy Scouts who haven and our visitors.) Scouts can choose to either help with these stations or meet with adult leaders for completing rank or Merit Badge requirements.

During these 40 minutes, Mrs. Martinez and other adult leaders will be hosting a Parent Orientation meeting and slideshow for our adult visitors and parents of new Troop 66 Scouts. This meeting will be held in the Chapel.

Also, since this is the last meeting before our Court of Honor, leaders and Merit Badge Counselors will be on hand to help Scouts finish up last minute requirements so Scouts can earn the next rank or finish up a Merit Badge. Scouts should check in with Mr. Larsen to make sure they both agree on what the Scout will be earning. Be patient, there is only one Mr. Larsen and LOTS of Scouts!

Photography Merit Badge Completion: Mrs. Ehlert has graciously offered to be on hand to help Scouts complete requirements #7 and #8 for the photography merit badge. Here are instructions from Mrs. Ehlert: "I will be available at that meeting to go over their photography project and talk with them about it. I'd ask that everyone please give me 10 minutes per scout to go over their projects and talk and I will do my best to get through everyone at the meeting. The boys are supposed to take a series of 10 to 12 photographs of an event or something that interests them and share with their MB counselor. I will accept photos on computer, tablet, phone, or in print so if you get lots of questions about how to get the images to me, that's what you can tell parents. The boy needs to be present at the meeting to walk me through his photographs, so an email with the pictures isn't enough to get the requirements signed off."

Astronomy Merit Badge Completion: Several Scouts took the Astronomy Merit Badge during Summer Camp last summer and need to finish Requirement #6b in order to earn this Merit Badge. Mrs. Martinez will be available at 8 pm (after the New Parent Meeting in the Chapel) to go over requirement #6b with a group of Scouts. However, Scouts need to print out the workbook and do some work prior to the meeting in order to get this signed off: Requirement 6b states: Sketch the phase and the daily position of the

Moon, at the same hour and place, for four days in a row. *(Must be done prior to getting this signed off)* Include landmarks on the horizon such as hills, trees, and buildings. Explain the changes you observe.
