General Announcements:

Re-registration for the upcoming Scouting year has started. Deadline for submitting reregistration fees and re-registration is next Monday, November 14.

Now is the time of year to re-register Scouts and Adult Leaders and recharter our Troop for the upcoming year. We put together a quick survey to gather inputs from all Scouts and Adult Leaders, even if you don't haven't been coming to meetings recently. We don't want to miss including anyone on our roster and recharter for the upcoming Scouting year. We ask that everyone complete this quick survey for every person in your family registered with Troop 66. For example, the Martinez family has two registered adult leaders and three Boy Scouts we would like to register for the upcoming year so we completed this survey five times for our family.

Also, re-registration fees are due. The fees are: \$24 BSA Dues, \$20 Troop Dues, and \$12 Boys Life Annual Subscription (optional) for a total of \$56. Registered adults are asked to pay the \$24 BSA Dues but the Troop will not assess adults the Troop Dues. Adult Leaders have the option of subscribing to Scouting Magazine for Adult Leaders for \$12/year for a total of \$36 for adults. Please submit your dues to Mr. Foss, or make sure there is enough money in your Scout Account to cover the dues and remain in the black. All of those who are in arrears with their Scout accounts

(with negative balances before October 1, 2016) need to bring their accounts into the positive, and include re-registration dues to be included in our recharter. It is too hard on the troop to carry large negative balances.

We have subscribed to a new web-based Troop management software that will help our Troop Leaders, parents and Scouts access and manage our advancement records, financials and communications. Please help us get you up-to-speed on this web based management software so we can streamline the activity management and workload on our adult leaders.
