General Announcements:

Renew Youth Protection in October: In preparation of our rechartering process, October will be designated as the month where all adult leaders will renew their Youth Protection online Training, regardless of when it expires. Our District now requires us to do this annually so we would like to sync this up for all of our adult leaders. It is best to have all adults who plan on attending activities to complete the Youth Protection Training. You do not need to be a registered adult leader to complete Youth Protection. We will also take this time to focus on other adult training for our leaders.

Many Scout Accounts are in Arrears: The Troop Committee met two weeks ago and there is concern over the number of Scout accounts that have negative balances. This is not healthy for our Troop and limits us to committing to doing activities. With the new TroopWebHost System (<https://www.troopwebhost.org/Troop66Longmont/Index.htm>), all families have the ability to check their account balances at any time. Our Treasurer and Assistant Scout Master, Fritz Foss, has many other duties with the troop so we need to help him by being proactive about checking and making payments to accounts. It is very nice for the troop if you keep some money in your account and not always hover around or under zero. The Troop Committee voted in a new financial policy that we will require Scout accounts be at least at zero before a Scout can commit to another activity, particularly high priced activities like Summer Camp. Please come speak to me or our Treasurer, Fritz Foss, if you need scholarship assistance BEFORE you commit to an activity. Scholarship money is not available to pay off negative balance accounts. Thanks so much for taking this seriously and staying on top of your financials.

Bring Your Scout Handbook to EVERY Meeting! It has come to our attention that several Scouts, first class rank or below, are not bringing their Scout Handbooks to the meetings. If you do not bring your book, then there is a good chance that the Scout will miss out on the sign-off of advancement requirements that were worked on that night. Remember any First Class or higher ranked Scout, or registered adult leader, can sign off on rank advancement requirements in the book if they witnessed the Scout doing those requirements. It is the Scouts responsibility to bring his own book, and make sure the requirements are signed off.

Class B T-shirts can be worn to Troop Meetings during the Summer! While school is out for the Summer, Scouts may wear Class-B shirts, instead of the full Class A uniform, to our regular troop meetings. However, if a Scout will be doing a Scoutmaster Conference or Board of Review, he is required to wear his full Class-A uniform on these occasions. Also, Scouts must be in the Class-B shirt, which is our summer uniform, to be part of the Color Guard at our meetings. A new batch of Class B T-shirts are now available for sale at our troop meetings. Also, a few Class B shirts are great to have at Summer Camp.

Troop Web Host is Live and we need all families on it, ASAP. We have subscribed to a new web-based Troop management software that will help our Troop Leaders,

parents and Scouts access and manage our advancement records, financials and communications. If you did not receive your login credentials from TroopWebHost, please email Mr. Foss at foss@airmail.net. **The next phase in our rollout is to get all activity sign-ups done through Troop Web Host starting right after Summer Camp.** This means we will be phasing out the paper sign-up sheets at Troop meetings. We are working on getting a laptop setup at our meetings for those who like to sign up at meetings and might be uncomfortable with computers. Please help us get you up to speed on this web based management software so we can streamline the workload on our adult leaders.

Reloadable King Soopers Cards: This is a friendly reminder to keep using those reloadable King Soopers gift cards for your grocery and gas purchases at any Kroger store in the country. The proceeds from this "passive" troop fundraiser are really making a difference in our troop's operating account.
