A message from Mr. Mathers:

The Popcorn Kick off will begin September 12, 2016 (this meeting)

You can pick up a small variety of popcorn to begin selling on that evening. I will pick up the popcorn on September 10th.

Scouts can register on-line to sell popcorn as well. They can receive up to 50% of the online sales for their commission. For Show and Deliver and Show and Sell sales, Scouts will receive 29% of their sales. The Scouts will have their commissions put into their Scout accounts.

There are five ways to sell popcorn:

1. Take an order on your order form, and deliver it to the customer as soon as you get the popcorn

2. Show and deliver, is when you have to popcorn at the time of the sale

3. Show and sell, is when our Troop sets up a display in front of a store

4. Selling on-line. Each Scout can sell on-line during the popcorn sales. The customer gets free shipping if they order three or more products

5. Selling at Work: Have your Scout go with you to work and sell popcorn.

Because we do not have a troop meeting on October 16, all popcorn orders and money are due to me(Mr. Mathers) by October 10. Also, any unsold popcorn must be returned that night.
