If you haven't already: **Sign Up NOW for Summer Camp 2018 at Camp Alexander**. This year Troop 66 will be attending camp at Camp Alexander located 45 miles west of Colorado Springs and 2 miles south of Lake George in Elevenmile Canyon **during the week of Jun 3-9, 2018**. The cost for the week is \$350/Scout which is payable in installments as described in the attached registration form.

In order for Troop 66 to secure your spot for Summer Camp, **you must complete the registration form** (attached here and also available at our Troop meetings), **and submit a \$35 non-refundable deposit** to "Troop 66," to Mr. Scott Francis, Troop 66 Treasurer, or Mrs. Martinez, Troop 66 Summer Camp Coordinator. Our troop has already submitted our registration but Scouts are still permitted to register (there is a chance the camp will fill up if you wait).
