General Announcements:

Many Scout Accounts are in Arrears: The Troop Committee met last week and there is concern over the number of Scout accounts that have negative balances. This is not healthy for our Troop and limits us to committing to doing activities. With the new TroopWebHost System (https://www.troopwebhost.org/Troop66Longmont/Index.htm, all families have the ability to check their account balances at any time. Our Treasurer and Assistant Scout Master, Fritz Foss, has many other duties with the troop so we need to help him by being proactive about checking and making payments to accounts. It is very nice for the troop if you keep some money in your account and not always hover around or under zero. The Troop Committee voted in a new financial policy that we will require Scout accounts be at least at zero before a Scout can commit to another activity, particularly high priced activities like Summer Camp. Please come speak to me or our Treasurer, Fritz Foss, if you need scholarship assistance BEFORE you commit to an activity. Scholarship money is not available to pay off negative balance accounts. Thanks so much for taking this seriously and staying on top of your financials.

Bring Your Scout Handbook to EVERY Meeting! It has come to our attention that several Scouts, first class rank or below, are not bringing their Scout Handbooks to the meetings. If you do not bring your book, then there is a good chance that the Scout will miss out on the sign-off of advancement requirements that were worked on that night. Remember any First Class or higher ranked Scout, or registered adult leader, can sign off on rank advancement requirements in the book if they witnessed the Scout doing those requirements. It is the Scouts responsibility to bring his own book, and make sure the requirements are signed off.

Rules for Use of Church Facilities:

If you have been in the church lately, you have seen that all of the renovations are complete. The fellowship hall looks amazing. There are a few new rules that we have implemented to help take care of the facilities and minimize our disruptions on others using the building.

Please enter our meetings through the Southwest door of the fellowship hall.
The bathrooms adjacent to the fellowship hall are now finished and usable. This means there should be no reason any Scouts or adults need to walk down the hallway past the Chapel. There are classes in the Chapel so please do not use the hallway adjacent to the Chapel.

3) There is a circle of soft chairs and a table on the northside of the fellowship hall. In order to protect this furniture, these chairs will be used ONLY for Scoutmaster Conferences or Board of Reviews. Scouts are not allowed to sit in these chairs in any other circumstances and we ask parents and adults to sit in other chairs in the room so we can reserve this area for official Scout meetings and keep a sound buffer between us and the meeting rooms on the north end of the fellowship hall.

4) Thanks to all Scouts and adults who set up chairs and tables for the meetings. The new flooring is susceptible to scratches and scuffs so we ask everyone to be careful when setting up and putting away tables and try not to drag them across the floor. this is also true for pulling things out of the Quartermaster Closet and in particular the large black flag stands. If you drag the flag stands, they will scratch the floor.

5) Outdoor spaces: With the warm weather, we can now have Scout activities and games outside in the grassy courtyard. The Scouts have been reminded many times of the rules in the Courtyard: no climbing on the bell tower, walls or tables and please do not go near the flower gardens on all sides of the grassy area.

Class B T-shirts can be worn to Troop Meetings during the Summer! While school is out for the Summer, Scouts may wear Class-B shirts, instead of the full Class A uniform, to our regular troop meetings. This means we will be phasing out the paper sign-up sheets at Troop meetings. We are working on getting a laptop setup at our meetings for those who like to sign up at meetings and might be uncomfortable with computers. Please help us get you up to speed on this web based management software so we can streamline the workload on our adult leaders.
